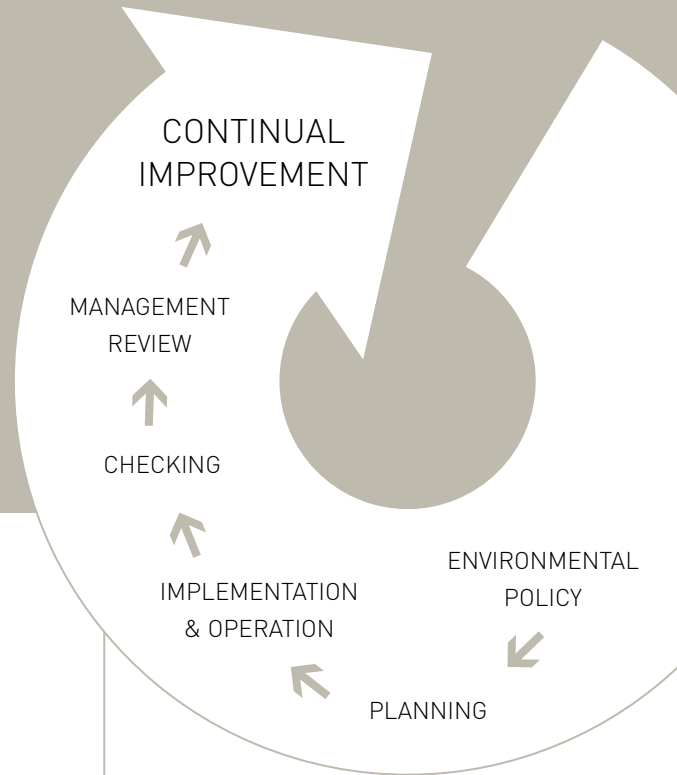

WHAT IS ISO 14001?

ISO 14001 is a commonly and widely recognised international standard for an Environmental Management System (EMS). The ISO 14001 standard specifies requirements for establishing an environmental policy, and planning environmental objectives and measurable targets. Companies implement an EMS certified under ISO 14001 in order to reduce the environmental impact associated with products, their manufacturing activities and their services.
